NOTICE OF VIOLATION - Inspection

Dear Operator:

Violations

Absent Well Identification Signs (Rule 103)

Comments on Inspection: Workover pit is open, noted in all inspections since 2003. Unlined, netted and fenced pit north of tank battery being used to drain overflow from gunbarrel. Plastic piping leaks before reaching pit, saturated soils at point of leak. Saturated soils north of PJ. Saturated soils south of tank battery. Heavy hardpan contamination west, south and northwest of tank battery.

Remediation is required. Contact NMOCD District 2 Environmental Compliance Officer with site ranking and remediation work plan.

Notify NMOCD District 2 Office 48 hours prior to any remediation work or prior to taking samples where results of the samples may be submitted to OCD.

No well sign found on location. Contact NMOCD District 2 Office when well sign is corrected.

In the event that a satisfactory response is not received to this letter of direction by the "Corrective Action Due By:" date shown above, further enforcement will occur. Such enforcement may include this office applying to the Division for an order summoning you to a hearing before a Division Examiner in Santa Fe to show cause why you should not be ordered to permanently plug and abandon this well. Such a hearing may result in imposition of CIVIL PENALTIES for your violation of OCD rules.
