We plan to trench bury the drilling pit at the Apache 24 Federal #10. As per rule 50 of the Pit and Below-Grade Tank Guidelines, we will line the trench with 12 mil liner and bury pit contents and liner then cover with 20 mil plastic. We will cap with 3' of native material capable of supporting native plant growth. We will contour the pit area to prevent erosion and ponding of rainwater over the site.
