Dear Mr. Knauf:

- My development plan as referenced above is as follows:
1. See Map Exhibit #1.
  2. See Map Exhibit #1 & #2. The proposed access road will be no wider than 12 feet and approximately 700 feet in length. The surface of this road will be compacted.
  3. See Map Exhibit #3.
  4. See Map Exhibits #1 & # 2.
  5. See Map Exhibit #1. There are no existing tank batteries and/or flow lines within a one-half mile radius of the proposed location.
  6. The small amount of water necessary for this shallow cable tool test will be purchased locally and stored on location in a skid-mounted tank or in a tank truck. There are no water lines in this area.
  7. All waste materials including garbage, trash, cuttings, etc. will be placed in large plastic sacks and transported to a proper city dump site in either Artesia or Roswell, New Mexico.
