DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED
 Total depth of this well was shown to be 1280 feet deep. Before plugging we shot this well with 20 quarts of glycerine, this work was done by the Independent-Eastern Torpedo Company of Artesia, New Mexico. This shot was set in the caprock, which confines the Artesian Water. After shooting we pumped in 28 tons of red clay mud shutting off all water. We then ran a 15 sack cement plug, that caprock at a depth of 560 feet. This is the method we have used for the last 18 years. Upon investigation March 29, 1950 we find this well to be permanently plugged.
