

8. ANCILLARY FACILITIES.

- A. None required.

9. WELLSITE LAYOUT.

- A. Exhibit D shows the relative location and dimensions of the well pad, reserve pits, and major rig components.
- B. The ground surface at this site is rolling mounds 6-8 feet in height, and the well location is on the southeasterly slope of one of these mounds. Approximately 1' cut and fill will be required to level the pad area, which will be covered with at least six inches of compacted caliche.
- C. The reserve pits will be plastic lined.
- D. The pad and pit area has been staked and flagged.

10. PLANS FOR RESTORATION OF THE SURFACE.

- A. After finishing drilling and/or completion operations, all equipment and other material not needed for further operations will be removed. The location will be cleaned of all trash and junk.
- B. Unguarded pits, if any, containing fluids will be fenced until they have been filled.
- C. This location being on fee land, cleanup operations will require no restoration other than filling and levelling as per agreement with Mr. Hal Bogle, land owner.
- D. All pits will be filled and leveled within 90 days after abandonment.

11. OTHER INFORMATION.

- A. Topography: The wellsite is in an area of gentle rises reaching 6-8 feet in height over a lateral distance of several hundred feet.
- B. The topsoil at the wellsite is hard packed sand and caliche.
- C. The vegetation cover at the wellsite is of a sparse amount, and consists primarily of prairie grass, miscellaneous weeds, and prairie flowers. No wildlife was observed, but it is likely that typical semi-arid desert wildlife, such as rabbits, coyotes, gophers, rodents and snakes inhabit the area. The area is used for cattle grazing.
- D. There are no ponds, lakes, streams, or rivers within several miles of the wellsite.
