Are we correct in assuming the operator should file Form C-104 and Form C-115 for the subject gas injection project supply well? Should the disposition of the gas be classified as "Lease Use" or should a more detailed explanation be made on Form C-115? Further, the supply well does not have 160 acres dedicated to it and is at a non standard location. As the gas is not being sold and is being used on the same lease is there any necessity to correct these matters?

We have contacted the U.S.G.S. and they will require production reports on the subject well, however, no royalty will be collected on the produced gas.
