## DETAILS OF WORK

Well was drilled to 460 and temp. abd. 10/22/52. Well never produced. Four inch casing cemented 437' with 25 sacks. Plugged same back to 400' with cement and gravel, shot and tried to salvabe casing at that point. Wouldn't come, tried again and finally got 55' leaving rest in hole. Filled hole and set bridge at 55' and set cement plug. Cemented required marker and cleaned up location. Lost tower book and cannot furnish well log at this late date.

Well was acidized with 1500 gallons and tested during Sept. 1952.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
