This will acknowledge receipt of your Forms C-101, Notice of Intention to Drill, in Section 4-17S-28E, Eddy County, New Mexico, which were forwarded to this office from the Commission office at Astec, New Mexico.

I note that you have designated this location as your #1 State well, and there is a #1 and #2 well in the southeast quarter of Section 4. I thought perhaps this should be a #3 well. However, our files show the #1 and #2 wells to have been drilled by Red Gulch with F. G. Keyes as operator, and the #2 well in SW/SE of Section 4 was plugged by Southern Union Gas Company in February, 1953, and we don't know the status of the #1 well in SE/SE of Section 4. Our file shows it to be in the name of Red Gulch with F. G. Keyes as operator.

We will appreciate your giving us some clarification regarding this matter of the #1 well in SE/SE of Section 4 and if your new well should be #3 we will just change the well number on the forms you have submitted.
