DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

A string of 3 1/2" casing was set in this well at 414' and cemented with 30 sacks of cement by Benton Cementing Co. Water was encountered at 250' and at 365'. After allowing 72 hrs for cement to set, the hole was sealed dry and casing was tested. As no water appeared, drilling was resumed.
