REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

The Director of the World Health Organization has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the report of the Committee of Experts on the Control of Tobacco, which was established by the Executive Board of the Organization in 1954. The Committee's report, dated 1956, contains a detailed analysis of the problem of tobacco consumption and its effects on health, and proposes a series of measures for the control of tobacco.

1. THE PROBLEM OF TOBACCO

The Committee of Experts on the Control of Tobacco, established by the Executive Board of the World Health Organization in 1954, has the honor to report to the Board on its work during the past year. The Committee's report, dated 1956, contains a detailed analysis of the problem of tobacco consumption and its effects on health, and proposes a series of measures for the control of tobacco.

The Committee has held several meetings and has received many suggestions from governments and the public. It has also conducted extensive research into the health effects of tobacco.

2. THE HEALTH EFFECTS OF TOBACCO
