Gentlemen:

With reference to your letter of April 21, 1961, I have today instructed Mr. Stamets of our Artesia office to assign your well in the SW/4 SW/4 of Section 35, Township 17 South, Range 28 East, Artesia Pool, an April allowable of 29 barrels per day, and in the future to assign your well an allowable which will be equal to the difference between the allowable which may be assigned to the Donnelly Well and top allowable. Of course, if your well declines in production, then the allowable should be reduced accordingly and in no event shall the total allowable of the two wells exceed the current normal unit allowable as established by the Commission.

Dear Sirs:

With reference to your letter of April 11, 1961, I have today instructed Mr. Starnes of our Alaska Office to assign your well in the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 35, Township 17 North, Range 28 East, Arctic Pool, as (gpm) allowable of 25 barrels per day, and in the future to assign your well an allowable which will be equal to the difference between the allowable which may be assigned to the normally well top allowable. Of course, if your well declines in production then the allowable should be reduced accordingly and in no event shall the total allowable of the two wells exceed the current normal unit allowable as established by the Commission.
