8 1/8 inch	At Boy's Landing	On October 24 1955 with a 7/8 bit the plug was left by hand and the hole cleaned out to 1247'. In cleaning out the hole, the top of the casing was then run and landed inside of the 5/8 inch casing at 415'. The cemented log was removed with 25 sacks of cement. After 600' bit was run to 411' depth and the hole cleared to 510'. No. 3 time was 24 hours. "No. 1" casing was then run and landed at 2962', and cemented with 150 cu. ft. of cement. On October 24 1955 with a 7/8 bit was perforated by the boy's landing.	October 24 1955	Perforated

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
