Effective 8/1/70, the allowables of the following Kennedy Oil Co. Inc. wells in the Sq. Lake Pool are hereby revised as indicated.


Carper Fed. #1-L, 19-16-31, increased to 50 BOPD, 1550 total

THE BUREAU OF PLANT INDUSTRY

The Bureau of Plant Industry is a part of the United States Department of Agriculture, and is located in the Department Building, Washington, D. C. It is the principal bureau of the Department for the study and promotion of the plant industries of the United States, and is especially concerned with the introduction and cultivation of foreign plants and fruits, and with the control of plant diseases and insect pests. The Bureau is organized into several divisions, each of which is headed by a Chief of Division, and each of which is further subdivided into sections. The divisions are: 1. Division of Horticulture, 2. Division of Forestry, 3. Division of Plant Pathology, 4. Division of Plant Quarantine, 5. Division of Plant Industry, and 6. Division of Plant Industry. The Bureau is also responsible for the collection and distribution of seeds and plants, and for the publication of bulletins and reports on plant industry.
