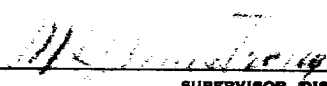
PURPOSE: ALLOWABLE REVISION & ASSIGNMENT (OLD WELL) (WATERFLOOD)

Effective April 1, 1964, the allowable of the Newmont Oil Company, Johnson, Well #3 P, 33-16-31, Square Lake Pool, is hereby increased from 110 barrels daily to 125 barrels daily or a total of 3750 barrels for the month.

Further, effective April 17, 1964, an allowable of 10 barr barrels daily or 140 barrels for the month is hereby assigned to the Newmont Oil Company, WLN Unit, Tract 6, Well #4 P, 12-18-29, in the Loco Hills Pool.
