

11. OTHER INFORMATION.

- A. Topography: The proposed wellsite is located in a relatively flat area, with only very minor surface undulations.
- B. The topsoil at the wellsite is moderately soft sandy loam.
- C. Flora and Fauna: The vegetation cover at the wellsite is relatively sparse, consisting of mesquite and miscellaneous prairie grasses and weeds. No wildlife was observed, but it is likely that typical semi-arid desert wildlife inhabit the area. The area is used for cattle grazing.
- D. There are no ponds, lakes, streams or rivers in the immediate vicinity of the wellsite.
- E. The nearest dwelling and windmill are located approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of the proposed wellsite.
- F. The wellsite is on federally owned surface. The access route to the location is on federally owned surface, with the exception of a portion of the existing road on state owned surface in Section 2.
- G. There is no evidence of any archeological, historical or cultural sites in the area of the wellsite.


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13. CERTIFICATION.
