- D. The pad and pit area has been staked and flagged.
- 10. PLANS FOR RESTORATION OF THE SURFACE.
 - A. After finishing drilling and/or completion operations, all equipment and other material not needed for further operations will be removed. The location will be cleaned of all trash and junk.
 - B. Unguarded pits, if any, containing fluids will be fenced until they have been filled.
 - C. This location being on Federal land, cleanup operations will be made in accordance with Fed. regulation. All pits will be filled and leveled within 90 days after abandonment.
- 11. OTHER INFORMATION.
 - A. Topography: The wellsite is in an area of gentle rolling eminences separated by playas on an undulating plain.
 - B. The topsoil at the wellsite is composed of silty clay loamsand silt loams.
 - C. The vegetation cover at the wellsite consists primarily of prairie grass, choya, mesquite, yucca, and miscellaneous weeds. No wildlife was observed, but it is likely that typical semi-arid desert wildlife, such as rabbits, coyotes, gophers, rodents and snakes inhabit the area. The area is used for cattle grazing.
 - D. There are no stock ponds, lakes, streams or rivers within several miles of the wellsite.
 - E. No occupied dwellings in the immediate vicinity.
 - F. The wellsite is located on Federally owned surface as is the proposed access road.
 - G. There is a windmill approximately 3960' to the NE of the proposed wellsite.
