WE PROPOSE TO DRILL THIS WELL AS FOLLOWS:

OBJECTIVE: Grayburg-Jackson Zone.

TOTAL DEPTH: Approximately 2980'.

CASING PROGRAM: Salt String - will set approximately 370' o 8-5/8" OD 24# casing at top of salt and cement with 50 sacks cement preceded by heavy mud to surface.

Production String - will set approximately 2740' of 7" OD 20# casing and cement with 100 sacks cement preceded by heavy mud to surface.

ACIDIZING PROGRAM: To be submitted at a later date.

DRILLING OPERATIONS TO COMMENCE: On or about September 4, 1950, with a company owned National Machine.

REMARKS: This unorthodox location was approved by NMOCC Order No. B-7. If commercial production is obtained well will be produced in conformance with NMOCC Order No. 802.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
