FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

We propose to dump in 15 sacks of cement at 3273 ft. and then fill with heavy mud to back to 905 feet - base of salt. Bridge hole at 905'. Dump in 5 sacks of cement, fill with mud to 490' - 8 3/8" shoe. Bridge hole at 490' feet dump in 5 sacks of cement, fill hole to surface with heavy mud and cap well with regulations markers.

Work to be done July 30, 1945 by Halliburton Oil Well Cementing Company.
