We ran 15 sack of cement at 3275', then filled well heavy mud back to 905' - B5
Bridged hole at 905', dumped in 5 sack of cement. Filled with mud to 490' - 8 3/4" shoe. Bridged hole at 490', dumped in 5 sack cement, filled hole to surface with heavy mud and capped well with regulation marker
Work was done on July 30, 1945 by Halliburton Oil Well Cementing Co.

DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

When in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. — That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, — That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, in such a case, dictates that慎重 should be exercised; and that no step should be undertaken which is fraught with the danger of inviting every individual to the exercise of his own private sense of right and wrong, instead of submitting to a judicious and disinterested tribunal.

But when a long train of abuses, usurpations, and oppressions, all of one long and dangerous character, presents itself, it is incumbent on those who regard the security of their rights to band together, to redress the grievances.

That the King has refused his assent to Laws most wholesome and necessary for the public good. That he has forbidden his Governors to pass Acts of the most urgent and important nature. That he has refused to assent to Acts of the most urgent and important nature.

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
