**DETAILS OF WORK**

We desire approval to drill Jackson 19-B to 3250 feet to test the Lovington Sand. Plan to run 8-5/8" and cement to top of salt, and run approximate 3,200 feet of 5" through the Lovington Sand; perforate and frac separately the Lovington and Square Lakes Sands. Both casing strings will be cemented and tested for water shut off.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
