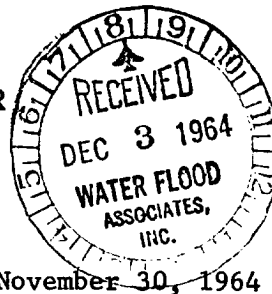


Dear Sir:

Your inquiry of November 20, 1964, requests information on subject well which you indicate as being plugged prior to acquisition of the lease by Water Flood Associates. Perhaps you have this well confused with No. 3 located 1980/N&E sec. 3, T. 17 S., R. 30 E., which was abandoned September, 1957. Your monthly report (form 9-329) reports production from subject well No. 4 through June 1963 and then shut-in to date. Also, your monthly waterflood progress report (NMOCC form C-120) reports subject well as shut-in.

A recent lease inspection indicated this well is not plugged. Our well file which is supported by well reports from the lease operator still shows that this well is a producing oil well. Accordingly, we are again requesting, on Sundry Notices and Reports (form 9-331), a report indicating:

1. Present status of well
2. When last produced
3. Your intentions for operating this well
