both zones together of said Woll No. 38 shall not be assigned more than one single top unit allowable for the Grayburg-Jackson Pool, unless said well is included in the unit waterflood project area. in which case both zones together may produce one single waterflood unit allowable.

By carbon copy of this letter, the Supervisor of the Artesia District Office of the Commission is requested to split the total allowable assigned to the well on the basis of the well tests and to show the well in two places in his proration schedule, once in the Grayburg-Jackson Pool as the Windrohr Unit Well No. 38, and once in the Square Lake Pool as the Jackson "B" Well No. 38, with each listing carrying an allowable. Provided however, that the sum of the allowables shall in no event exceed a single top allowable.

Windfohr is requested on its Form C-115, Producer's Monthly Report, to likewise list the well twice, once in the Grayburg-Jackson Pool and once in the Square Lake Pool, showing the allowable assigned and the production attributed to each zone.

While it is recognized that this is a somewhat unorthodox manner of handling this well, it is believed that it is the simplest method and will involve less bookkeeping and possible confusion than any other method we know of.
