Confirming Telephone conversation between J.L. Briscoe and the District Engineer of United States Geological Survey in Artesia, New Mexico.

On September 21, 1951 we set 2363.96 feet of 7", 17#.20# and 23# casing using 100 sacks of cement and 10 sacks of Aquagel for heavy mud which was circulated before the cement was run. Cement was run by Halliburton Oil Well Cementing Company.

This stood 72 hrs. and was bailed dry and tested before drilling was resumed.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
