10. Plans for Restoration of the Surface:

- A. After completion of drilling and/or completion operations, all equipment and other material not needed for operations will be removed. Pits will be filled and location cleaned of all trash and junk to leave the wellsite in an aesthetically pleasing a condition as possible.
- B. Any unguarded pits containing fluids will be fenced until they are filled.
- C. After abandonment of the well, surface restoration will be in accordance with the BLM and accomplished as expeditiously as possible.

11. Other Information:

- A. Topography: Land surface is an undulating plain w/some erosion & gullying. Drainage is minimal, slightly westward.
- B. Soil: Soil is a sandy loam & eroded with chert, quartzite & caliche lag deposits.
