As offset operator of the above captioned well, we respectfully request a retest of the well's deliverability. The order of the division (Order No. R-6415) under Rule 7 states, "The operator shall notify the appropriate district office of the division and all offset operators of the date and time of initial or special deliverability tests in order that the division or any such operator may at their option witness such tests."

To the best of my knowledge, ARCO was not notified prior to the deliverability test run on the well on March 26, 1981. I contacted Mr. Larry Shepard, in your Hobbs office, and he does not remember trying to contact ARCO. He said as a general rule he usually contacts the commission and the gas purchaser to witness deliverability tests. I realize this was probably an oversight; however, we ask that a retest be scheduled as soon as possible so that ARCO personnel may witness such a test.
