Dayton Grayburg

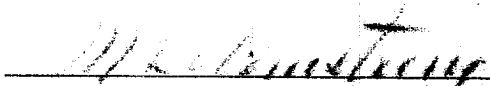
Platt, Well #1 M, 26-18-26, 1 barrel daily or 25 barrels
