DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

The section from 1126 to 1140 was loaded with 75 qts. glycerin bomb was set for 11 hrs. A tamp of 35 ft. pea gravel. then the hole was loaded with oil. the shot went off per schedule and we begin drilling the bridge. when the bridge was broken there was not any pressure and then the well was on a vacuum and 300ft of lead oil went down the hole and apparently carried all loose sand back into the formation. This oil gradually returned but when the well was put on production it slowly dropped day by day until it was only making one to two bbls.
