Mr. Walter Solt, of Artesia, N.M., has asked me to write to you concerning the plugging of the above captioned well.

Upon investigation it was found that the water at the bottom of the hole had been temporarily shut-off with a steel wool plug and a cement bridge set at 1400 feet. In order for the well to be properly plugged we feel that it will be necessary for the person carrying out the plugging operations to drill out this cement bridge at 1400 feet and go back to the bottom of the hole to test for a successful water shut-off. This is necessary because of the oil zone at the 1600 to 1800 foot level.

Mr Solt stated that because of the fact that a drilling machine would have to be used he could not do the plugging work.

I do not know how much this operation would cost. I have enclosed a summary of the work that would have to be done before the Commission would approve the plugging.

If you desire I will get in touch with several local operators who might be interested in this plugging job and have them get in touch with you.
