FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

We propose to plug the above well in the following manner. Fill with mud from TD 2503 to 2135. Set a cement plug from 2235 to 2225. Fill with mud to 1285. Set cement plug from 1285 to 1275. Pull 7" casing and 10" casing and then fill with mud to 330 feet. Set cement plug from 330 to 295 and then fill with mud to surface and set cement plug with regulation 4 foot pipe marker.
