We have prepared and enclosed herewith a complete copy of our well file here in the Artesia office of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission for the above mentioned well which your company drilled in 1951 & 1952 as per your request by telephone December 5, 1953.

You will note by the copy of the Scout Ticket, that the well was temporarily Abandoned on August 1, 1951 at a total depth of 2540', and was respudded on or about December 10, 1951, and drilled to a total depth of 3893', and was plugged and abandoned April 24, 1952.
