Report of the Special Agent in Charge, Bureau of Plant Industry, United States Department of Agriculture, on the results of his investigation of the cause of the loss of the cotton crop in the State of Mississippi, during the season of 1917.

The following is a summary of the results of the investigation:

The cotton crop in the State of Mississippi, during the season of 1917, was lost as a result of the action of the boll weevil, *Anthonomus grandis* Boh.
