Gentlemen:

We have been notified by Mr. Harvey E. Yates that the subject marginal well has been shut in for two months because the storage is full and Texas-New Mexico Pipeline Company refuses to take the oil. You may recall that we discussed this situation over the phone last month at which time you informed me that to take the oil would cause the well to be excessively "over-run." It does not appear that this situation could still be the cause of your failure to take the oil, as 27 allowable days have passed and the allowable of the well has been increased by supplements No. A-60(dated April 21, 1960) and No. A-38(dated May 1, 1960).

If there is still any reason why this oil cannot be run please call Mr. Yates' office collect, so that the situation may be rectified. If there is no reason for not running the oil please proceed to do so as quickly as possible.
