On Dec. 11, 1979, acidized new perforations at 3471-77 with 500 gals. 15% acid. Treated at 2800 psi. at 3 BPM. Fraced perforations at 3471-3548 with 15,000 gals. RF-40 gel + 10,000# FLA-100 sand + 7,250# 20-40 sand, preceded by 1,000 gals. 15% acid. Treated at 3,050 psi. at 9.4 BPM.

Treatment increased injectivity from 210 barrels of water per day to 255 barrels per day.

Instructions

General: This form is designed for submitting proposals to perform certain well operations, and reports of such operations when completed, as indicated, on Federal and Indian lands pursuant to applicable Federal law and regulations, and, if approved or accepted by any State, on all lands in such State, pursuant to applicable State law and regulations. Any necessary special instructions concerning the use of this form and the number of copies to be submitted, particularly with regard to local, area, or regional procedures and practices, either are shown below or will be issued by, or may be obtained from, the local Federal and/or State office.

Item 4: If there are no applicable State requirements, locations on Federal or Indian land should be described in accordance with Federal requirements. Consult local State or Federal office for specific instructions.
