- B. The ground surface at the drilling location is relatively flat, with virtually no undulations. Only very minor cut and fill will be required to level the pad area and the access road.
- C. The reserve pits will be plastic lined.
- D. The pad and pit area has been staked and flagged.
- 10. PLANS FOR RESTORATION OF THE SURFACE.
 - A. After finishing drilling and/or completion operations, all equipment and other material not needed for further operations will be removed. The location will be cleaned of all trash and junk to leave the wellsite in as aesthetically pleasing a condition as possible.
 - B. Unguarded pits, if any, containing fluids will be fenced until they have been filled.
 - C. If the proposed well is non-productive, all rehabilitation and/or vegetation requirements of the Bureau of Land Management and the United States Geological Survey will be complied with and will be accomplished as expeditiously as possible. All pits will filled and leveled within 90 days after abandonment.
- 11. OTHER INFORMATION.
 - A. Topography: The wellsite and access route are located on a relatively flat surface.
 - B. The topsoil at the wellsite is moderately soft earth. The vegetation cover is relatively heavy, consisting primarily of prairie grass and miscellaneous weeds. The only wildlife observed were rabbits, but rancher Tom Harrison stated that the area is heavily populated with rattlesnakes, and it is also likely that other wildlife typical of semi-arid desert land inhabit the area. The section on which the proposed wellsite is located is used for cattle and horse grazing, and several domestic turkeys were also observed in the area.
 - C. There are no ponds or lakes within several miles of the wellsite. The nearest river is the Penasco which passes within approximately 1,000 feet of the location, but which is normally dry, as it is at the present time.
 - D. The nearest occupied dwellings are two ranch houses, one approximately a quarter of a mile and the other, approximately a half-mile, south of the location. The latter ranch house is the residence of rancher Tom Harrison, who has the grazing lease on the federal surface at the proposed location. There are windmills and/or water pumps at these ranch house locations.
 - E. The surface at the well site is acquired federal land and
