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10. Plans for Restoration of the Surface:

- A. After completion of drilling and/or completion operations, all equipment and other material not needed for operations will be removed. Pits will be filled and location cleaned of all trash and junk to leave the wellsite in an aesthetically pleasing a condition as possible.
- B. Any unguarded pits containing fluids will be fenced until they are filled.
- C. After abandonment of the well, surface restoration will be in accordance with the BLM and accomplished as expeditiously as possible.

11. Other Information:

- A. Topography: Land surface is generally flat plains.
- B. Soil: Soil is predominantly sand loam w/fragmented caliche.
- C. Flora & Fauna: The flora consists of primarily grasses such as blue grama, sideoats, grama, sand dropseed, mesquite and broom snakeweed. The fauna consists of coyotes, jack rabbits, cotton tails, skunks, snakes, rodents, hawks, song birds, quail, dove, occasional deer.

D. Ponds & Streams: None

E. Residences and other structures: None within a 1 mile radius.

F. Land Use: Grazing and hunting in season. Oil & gas production.

G. Surface Ownership: Wellsite is on federal surface.
