11. OTHER INFORMATION:

- A. Topography: The area around the well location is relatively flat.
- B. Soil: Loam
- C. <u>Flora and Fauna</u>: The vacinity surrounding the drillsite is semi-arid desert rangeland. Vegetation consists of native grasses interspersed with yucc, cholla and other cacti. No wildlife was observed, but wildlife in this habitat consists mostly of rabbits, rodents, coyotes, skunks, dove and quail.
- D. Ponds and Streams: None in immediate area. Fourmile Draw is one mile to the south.
- E. <u>Residences and Other Structures</u>: 'Jearest occupied dwelling is one mile to the northwest. Nearest water well is also one mile to the northwest.
- F. <u>Archaeological</u>, <u>Historical</u> and <u>Other Cultural Sites</u>: None were observed in the area. An archaeological reconnaissance of the well pad and road area was made by the New Mexico Archaeological Services, Inc. on Compare 22, 1980.
- G. Land Use: Grazing and occasional hunting.
