STATEMENT OF THE SILVER MINING COMMISSION

The Silver Mining Commission was organized by the Legislature of the State of New Mexico in 1907, under the provisions of Chapter 100, Laws of 1907. It has since that time been engaged in a study of the silver mining industry in this State, and has the honor to submit to the Legislature its report for the year 1910.

The Commission has held numerous public hearings, and has received many suggestions from the mining industry, the general public, and the Legislature. It has also conducted extensive research into the various problems connected with the silver mining industry, and has endeavored to formulate a policy which will be in the best interests of the State.

The Commission believes that the silver mining industry is one of the most important of the State, and that it is entitled to the same consideration and protection as any other industry. It believes that the State should take such action as will be necessary to protect the industry from unfair competition, and to secure for it the same advantages and privileges as are enjoyed by other industries.
