Gentlemen:

In reply to your letter of December 15, 1964, in regards to the captioned well, your records are apparently correct. Operation of this well was taken over from Delhi-Taylor Oil Corporation by Tenneco Oil Company on September 1, 1964. We can find no records in the files turned over to us that dual application forms, packer leakage tests or packer setting affidavits were ever submitted.
