#### ABSTRACT

New Mexico Archaeological Services, Inc., representing WESTALL AND MASK, Roswell, undertook an archaeological reconnaissance of Bureau of Land Management lands scheduled to be impacted by the construction of a power line. The investigated easement will be situated in Sections 27 and 34, T18S, R31E, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico. No cultural resources were recorded during this reconnaissance, and hence NMAS is *suggesting* clearance for WESTALL AND MASK's proposed work.

## Introduction

On 23 September 1981, New Mexico Archaeological Services, Inc., (NMAS), Carlsbad, undertook for WESTALL AND MASK, Roswell, an archaeological reconnaissance of lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management in Eddy County, New Mexico. The reconnoitered easement will be impacted by the construction of a power line. This project was advanced by Mr. Richard Barton, WESTALL AND MASK, and administered by Dr. J. Loring Haskell, Principal Investigator, NMAS, Inc. This reconnaissance was undertaken by Dr. Haskell.

#### Survey Technique

For this investigation, WESTALL AND MASK's proposed easement was investigated for evidence of man's past activities by walking it in two, 35 ft wide, close interval (15° o less), zigzag transects. Methodologically, this procedure served to promote optimal conditions for the visual examination of areas to be impacted by construction-related activities.

## Location

As proposed, WESTALL AND MASK's easement will measure 30 X 1320 ft on federal lands and will be situated in the:

SE\SW\, Section 27, T18S, R31E, NMPM, Eddy County, NM NE\SW\, Section 34, T18S, R31E, NMPM, Eddy County, NM Map Reference: USGS CLAYTON BASIN QUADRANGLE, 15 Minute Series, 1942. <u>Terrain</u>

WESTALL AND MASK's proposed power line easement will cross a generally flat landform broken by the occurrence of occasional subsidence structures. These latter features are overlain by a deposit of aeolian material of Pliestocene and Holocene age. Associated soils developing from this parent

material are stable in character being composed of loamy sands and sandy loams. Pedons belong to the Typic Torripsamment subgroup.

#### Floristics

Local soils are supportive of a mixed overstory of Quercus havardii, Prosopis juliflora, and Yucca glauca. Attendant forbs include Eriogonum annuum, Gutierrezia sarothrae, Croton sp., Suaeda sp., and Dithyrea sp. The Gramineae is represented by Andropogon sp., Aristida sp., Chloris cucuclata, Munroa squarrosa, and Sporobolus flexuosus.

#### Cultural Resources

No cultural properties were recorded during the course of this reconnaissance. Reasons cited for their absence include a dearth of potentially knappable material as well as a usual shortage of potable water. Additionally shelter is scarce in the immediate vicinity as well.

#### Recommendations

NMAS recommends clearance for WESTALL AND MASK's power line (Hinkle Federal "F" Well No. 7) easement and *suggests* that work-related activities proceed in accordance with company plans. Clearance, of course, is granted by the Bureau of Land Management. If cultural resources are encountered during construction, the BLM and NMAS should be notified immeditately. Duned settings are notorious for covering and uncovering cultural properties.

STANDARD RIGHT-OF-WAY STIFULATIONS FOR OVERHEAD FLECTRIC DISJELEU PLON CAS LINES IN THE ROSWELL DISTRICT, BLM ROSWELL, New MEXICO

Grantee uprees to comply with the following sticulations to the satisfaction of FLM's Ronwell District Manager.

1. Clearing and blacing necessary for construction will be held to the absolute minimum. Without prior agreement, these actions will not exceed those with the pre-construction (respection. Vegetation restried will be "walkbo-cown" in place.

2. Granthe will post the BLM serial number assigned to this hight-of-way in a constitutus pluce where the hight-of-way intersects existing heads on highways. Along hights-of-way banalleling heads on highways, BLM serial numbers will be posted where the hight-of-way first chosses the public lands and where it finally leaves the public lands, unless otherwise agreed upon.

3. Unless otherwise agreed upon in writing, powerlines will be constructed according to standards as outlined in Supposted Practices for Papton Protection on Powerlines, Papton Research Poundation, Inc., Department of Doblogy - 167 Wild, Brigham Young University, or Rural Electrification Bulletin 61-10, dated Sectorper 14, 1973, entitled "Protection of Bald and Solden Eagles from Powerlines." Trase publications provide sufficient information on prase stacing, configuration, and grounding in order to preclude the existence of significant nations to large perching birds. A copy of these publications may be obtained at the Popwell District Office. However, the BuM reserves the right to require modifications or additions to all powerline structures placed on this right-of-way, should they be determined as necessary to ensure the safety of large perching birds. Such modifications will be made by the grantee, with the first birds of large to the United States.

4. Industry officials shall assume the burden and excense of proving that the designs not shown in Suggested Practices for Raptor Protection on Powerlines of in Runal Electrofication Eucletin 61-10, are leagle safe." Such proof shall be unclided by a reptor expert approved by the BLM State Director.

5. Care will be taken by the grantee to assure that scenic values are not dataged in the disposal of waste materials. Any large rocks which are left in the area as a result of construction activities will be placed so that they do not detract from the scenic view and do not hinder the movement of livestock or of big game animals. These residual rocks will not be piled or left in rows.

6. In those areas where erosion control structures are required to stabilize soil word tions, the grantice will install such structures as are suitable for the schedific soil conditions being encountered and which are in accordance with sched resource management practices.

7. To present slacking of fance wire, the grantee will brace and tie-off each existing force to be unused, before cutting. During construction, the opening will be particulation will be restored to a condition which is equal to or better then the uniposed, by the grantee. Cattleguards and adjacent gates which use of a cultuble with will also be installed in any funce where a road created forming this to condition is to be regularly travaled.

8. If a natural burnler which was being used for livestock control, is the function during economic tien, the prestre will adequately fonce the area to present write of livestock. Such foncing will be at his own expense.

9. Rights of way will not be fonced, nor will public access be restricted by the grantee, without operation approval being granted by BLM's Poswell
