Gentlemen:


On behalf of our client, David Fasken, we are requesting a supplemental allowable assignment on the subject well in the amount of 850 barrels. This will enable us to sell all oil produced from this temporarily abandoned well.

A testing allowable of 1500 barrels was assigned October 5, 1972. While testing the Canyon, 937 barrels were run against this allowable in October and November 1972. Since that time the tubing, tubing casing annulus, emulsion treater, power oil line and flow line were flushed with water. Along with the closing stock at the end of November 1972, the power oil for Kobe pump operation and the oil flushed out of the system, we have on hand approximately 850 barrels of crude oil.

There is a possibility of recompleting this well in the Cisco if our current operations on the east offset, Arco "3" Federal No. 1, are successful.
