7:00 PM flowing 60 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
8:00 PM flowing 50 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
9:00 PM flowing 50 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
10:00 PM flowing 40 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
11:00 PM flowing 40 psi cn 1/2" choke.

6/29/83: 12:00 AM flowing 30 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
1:00 AM flowing 20 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
2:00 AM flowing 20 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
3:00 AM flowing 20 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
4:00 AM flowing 20 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
5:00 AM flowing 15 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
6:00 AM flowing 20 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
7:00 AM flowing 15 psi cn 1/2" choke.  
flowing very little water.  
R.U. swab made 2 runs no sign hydrocarbon gas, tested after  
each run flare would not light.  
Made 6 more swab runs and swabbed to seating nipple.  
Had recovered thru run No. 9 20 bbls load.  
Waited 35 minutes between 9 and 10 runs.  
Run No. 10 PF S.N. and recovered 500' gassy fluid, approx  
3/4 bbl.  
Waited 35 minutes.  
Run No. 11 PF S.N. recovered 500' gassy fluid.  
Waited 1 hour.  
Run No. 12 PF S.N. recovered 650' gassy fluid. SI at 4:00  
PM. Load to recover approximately 955 bbls, have recovered  
approx 330 bbls.

6/30/83: After 15-1/2 hours SI pressure 585 psi. Open on 3/4" choke,  
choke had cut out. Flowing back nitrogen, when reached 50  
psi natural gas to top pressure faded to -0-. R.U. Swab.  
Run No. 1 FL 4500' FS, PF 6300', recovered 1800', no blow  
behind swab.
