1. MIRU pulling unit.
2. Installed BOP's & drilled out cement to PBTD 8709'. Tested DV tool @ 7485' to 1000' psig. Held OK.
3. Ran GR-CBL-CCL from 8684'-7500'. Good bond across zone of interest.
4. Perforated Second Bone Spring Carbonate from 8030'-96' with 2 JSPF.
5. Tested workstring to 5000 psig. Held OK. Tested backside to 1000 psig. Held OK.
6. Acid fractured Second Bone Spring Carbonate from 8030'-96' with 10,000 gals gelled 15% HCl dropping 275 balls for diversion.
7. Placed well on test flowing to frac tank.
