Dear Sir:

Receipt is acknowledged of your "Notice of Intention to Drill"  
dated June 21, 1937 covering Survey No. 3 on the  
subject land in the 4th Sec. 10 T. 2 N. R. 20 E. You outline details  
of proposed work as follows:

"Will mud in either 8 5/8" or 10 3/4" at about 1500'. Will cement at approx. 450'  
with 50 sacks and circulate mud ahead of cement. Will cement at approx. 1580'  
with 65 or 70 sacks of cement, circulating mud ahead of cement to clean up for job  
on cement. This is to be the 10" to the 7" hole with cement. Will salt cement  
on a 1" basis to assure a bond through the salt section as is usual. Will drill  
to about 1635' and may possibly add size with 2 1/2 to 1000 gallons of acid if the  
formation is tight, as we only have the latest possible amount of acid to assure  
maximum recovery from the salt section of gas. Will start running up this  
coming week and will not start until either late 10 or receive confirmation.  
510' from south state Federal requirements of within 100' of center of quarter  
section."

Your proposed work is hereby approved subject to compliance with  
the provisions of Section 2 of the "Oil and Gas Operating Regulations",  
revised November 1, 1936, copy of which will be sent you on request.

See attached sheet for general and special conditions of approval.

Records and written notices relating to these well operations must  
be submitted to this office in accordance with Section 5 of said operating  
regulations. Any proposed change of detail of the work outlined above  
must be submitted to this office on Form 9-331a in triplicate and ap-  
proval obtained before such work is commenced.
