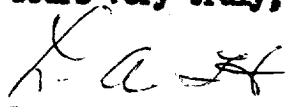
Gentlemen:

Your letter of July 11, 1955 to the Oil Conservation Commission at Santa Fe with reference to the above captioned well and the designation of a pool for the area has been forwarded to this office for an answer.

First I would like to point out that before a new pool can be designated you must file Commission forms C-104 Request for Oil Allowable and C-110 Certificate of compliance and Authorization to transport oil with this office here in Artesia for approval and distribution, and after an allowable has been assigned by the proration manager we will forward Forms C-123 Request for Creation of a new pool designation or extension of an existing pool for you to complete and return to this office.

The Nomenclature Committee has been out of existence more than five years, therefore new pools are created by Commission hearing called by the Oil Conservation Commission upon its own motion, at this point I should like to mention that it is not in keeping with Commission policy to name a pool after an operator or a representative of an operator, we prefer that a geographical or an old established ranch name representative of the area in which the Discovery well is located be used in the naming of pools. Since the proration order for the month of July expires at 7 AM August the 1st, 1955 you should make every effort to file your Form's C-104 and C-110 immediately so that you will not miss your allowable for July.
