After 36 hours pipe tested with 1800#. Pipe tested O.K. ON Dec. 14, 1965 ran 2 3/8" 4.70# J-55 Tubing. Set @ 7481'. Packer set @ 7351'. Open Hole Completion. T.D. 7500'. Thru 3/4" Choke Well Tested 16,000 MCF. Tubing Pressure 1100# Flowing. 2 hour Test. Well Treated with 500 gal. Mud acid and 500 gal DS-50 15% acid.
