Gentlemen:

Please find a corrected Form C-103 on the subject well. The 8-5/8" casing string is indeed circulated to surface as your files indicate. The Heyco State No. 1 well was originally drilled and abandoned by Western Oil Producers in the first half of 1974. A review of drilling records indicate that on 6/28/74 8-5/8" casing was set at 3930' and cemented with 800 sxs of Howco Lite plus 150 sxs of Class "C" with 2% CaCl. Approximately 160 sxs were circulated to the pit. Coquina Oil Corporation re-entered the well on 8/24/74. The problem occurred in the transference of information to Coquina's records. Our files have now been corrected.

The perforations at 11,140-82' (36 holes) were tested during the original completion zone and these perforations were abandoned on October 23, 1974 by setting a CIBP at 11,120' with 20' of cement on top of the plug. The remaining intervals were perforated and reported on Form C-103 dated January 13, 1975. A Form C-103 is enclosed to reflect the perforations at 11,140-82' which were left off the previous filings. All perforations are within the Strawn interval.

During the productive life of this well the individual intervals began watering out and a second plug was set at 11,040' and capped with 20' of cement. The third plug is a cement retainer set in March
