Dear Mr. Bruce:

Reference is made to your letter to the Director dated September 5, 2002, but is stamped as being received on September 4, 2002, requesting approval that Ocean Energy, Inc. be allowed to continue producing Strawn gas from its Burton Flat Deep Unit Well No. 13 (**API No. 30-015-21125**) located 660 feet from the South line and 1980 feet from the East line (Unit O) of Section 28. This matter was passed to me only late yesterday afternoon for a decision; I apologize for the Division's delay in addressing your motion.

Review of this matter clearly shows that Ocean Energy, Inc. has been producing this well without a proper assignment of acreage since September, 2001. Ocean shall therefore abide with the Artesia District Office's order that this well be shut-in until a proper 320-acre unit is either assigned voluntarily and compulsorily or a 160-acre is approved retroactively to date of first production.
