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10. Plans for Restoration of the Surface:

- A. After completion of drilling and/or completion operations, all equipment and other material not needed for operations will be removed. Pits will be filled and location cleaned of all trash and junk to leave the wellsite in an aesthetically pleasing a condition as possible.
- B. Any unguarded pits containing fluids will be fenced until they are filled.
- C. After abandonment of the well, surface restoration will be in accordance with the BLM and accomplished as expeditiously as possible.

11. Other Information:

A. Topography: Land surface is sloping northwest approx 10' per 400'.

B. Soil: Soil is a sparse. mostly hard limestone-caliche rock.

- C. Flora & Fauna: The vegetative cover is generally sparse and consists of cat claw bush and very sparse perenial native range grasses. Wild life in the area is typical of semi-arid desert and includes coyotes, rabbits, rodents, reptiles, hawk, quail, dove and occasional deer.
- D. Ponds & Streams: None a dry arroya (Spence Draw) is approx 1680' north of location and runs from southwest to northeast.
- E. Residences and other structures: None
- F. Land Use: Grazing and hunting in season. and oil and gas production.

 G. Surface Ownership: Wellsite is on BLM surface.Mr. L. J. Kincaid, 1050 Standpipe road, Carlsbad is currently holding BLM grazing lease. Mr. Kincaid
