No archaeological sites or isolated manifestations were recorded during this reconnaissance. This landform was tapped on a sporadic and ephemeral bases by prehistoric hunters and gathers from Ar chaic times onward. Actual occupancy typically was short lived and undoubtedly seldom exceeded an overnight stay at any locality owing to a paucity of vital resources.

Recommendations

NMAS recommends clearance for COQUINA OIL CORPORATION'S proposed Pure Gold "B" Federal Well No. 1 and its access road and <u>sugrests</u> that work-related activities proceed in accordance with company plans. Clearance, of course, is granted by the Eureau of Land Management.
