10. Plans for Restoration of the Surface (continued)

c. After abandonment of the well, surface restoration will be in accordance with the agreement with the surface owner. Pits will be filled and location will be cleaned. The pit area, well pad and all unneeded access road will be ripped to promote revegetation. Rehabilitation should be accomplished within ninety (90) days after abandonment.

11. Other Information

- a. Topography: Land surface is a low rolling hill.
- b. Soil: Soil is caliche overlain by a small amount of sand.
- c. <u>Flora and Fauna</u>: Vegetative cover is generally greasewood and mesquite with small amounts of grass. Wildlife in the area is that typical of semi-arid desert land and includes coyotes, rabbits, rodents, reptiles and birds.
- d. <u>Ponds and Streams</u>: There are no rivers, streams, lakes or ponds in the immediate area of the proposed location.
- e. <u>Residences and Other Structures</u>: There is no dwelling in the immediate area of the proposed location.
- f. Land Use: Land is used for hunting in season and grazing.
- g. Surface Ownership: Well site is on Federal surface.
